

## How We Met





Our greatest prayer as parents is that our kids would know and love Jesus and walk with Him every day of their lives. Here are a few character traits we model in our home that we will instill in our children:


- A Love for God's Word: We want our children to have a love for Scripture and look to it for wisdom and to grow closer to God.
